

LEARNING VS. TESTING

I remember when I was younger, I was obsessed with getting taller. I grew up with older brothers who played basketball and height was a key factor for me to beat them. My parents would track how much I had grown with a mark on the wall, along with my brothers and sister. I would watch with eager anticipation regularly to see if it was time for a new mark.

Measurement is an important component of our day-to-day life, whether it is how much water we drink, how fast we drive, the 4G data on our phone, or the test scores in school. We use measurement to help the world make sense. Unfortunately, this can be very counterproductive when it comes to the learning environment and expectations we have for students. Though we want to measure our students academic progress, we need to be careful to avoid letting school assessments define our children. Everyday there is an increase of the amount of information accessible to students. This information is at the same time becoming less standardized, making it very difficult to decide what information students should and shouldn't know. Beyond the core subjects of reading , writing, mathematics, and research, which will always be a focus for schools, the global culture of creativity, design, innovation, discovery, adaptability, and rapid change are becoming more important than ever.

As parents and teachers, it becomes our responsibility to embrace and cultivate the value of learning vs. testing, place emphasis on thinking vs. memorizing, and celebrate creativity vs. replication. As we approach MAP testing in a couple of weeks, it is important to keep this in mind. There will continue to be a shift in the importance and weight of standardized testing for students as they grow up in the modern classroom. Having this conversation with our students is a critical factor of developing the right mind set for 21st century learning. Though it is a valid piece in the puzzle, it is only one piece among many others. The growth necessary for our students goes far beyond a percent on a test, grade on a paper, percentile among a group of students, or, like my height, a mark on the wall.

SAFETY AND SECURITY GUIDELINES

The safety and security of our students and your children is of utmost importance to the school. For this reason, it is importance for us to practice and communicate regularly any safety concerns and procedures at KIS. Regular safety drills are part of our general safety and security plan that will be practiced throughout the year. Safety First

Friday, September 15th

Please see the 4 safety and security actions below that KIS follows.

Next Friday, the school will practice a Lockdown and Fire Evacuation.



Lockout is followed by the Directive: "Secure the Perimeter" and is the protocol used to safeguard students and staff within the building.



Lockdown is followed by "Locks, Lights, Out of Sight" and is the protocol used to secure individual rooms and keep students quiet and in place.



Evacuate is always followed by a location, and is used to move students and staff from one location to a different location in or out of the building.



Shelter is often a response to poor weather preventing the school from dismissing, but may also include a response to any natural disasters or civil unrest.



SMS Test Run - Friday, September 15th

On Friday, September 15th, the school will send out a text message using our bulk SMS message system to all parents. This is to test the system and unsure that all parents are receiving these messages. The message will be sent out around 10:00am. If you do not receive this message, please notify the school.

Regular Testing Schedule - September 18-29 Make Up Testing - October 2-6

We give students MAP tests to help monitor your child's instructional level and to measure academic growth throughout the school year and from year to year in the areas of mathematics, reading, and language usage. These tests help to give a measure of your child's academic development at one moment in time. It is important to note that understanding your child's academic standing and progress is a puzzle with many pieces. The MAP tests are certainly a worthy measure, but they are simply one of the pieces that we use with a variety of assessments, observations, and monitoring. The results from these tests will be available shortly after all testing has been completed. If you have questions about MAP, please feel free to contact school administrators or your child's teacher.
